## The Silent Witness Story

In 2005, 32 South Carolinians were murdered by their intimate partners. As citizens of this state, we have a responsibility to take a stand against this injustice. Therefore, our State joined with more than forty other states in a mission "to promote peace, healing and responsibility in adult relationships."

During the Silent Witness ceremony, wooden silhouettes represent the women and men who have died due to domestic violence in South Carolina during the previous year. This year, there are 32 silhouettes; 27 are for the known female homicide victims, 5 are for the known male homicide victims, and one represents those victims of which we are unaware.

The Attorney General's Office, through the S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women program, hosts this annual remembrance. Other contributing citizens and organizations are acknowledged at the end of this book.

This book is dedicated to the women and men of South Carolina who have lost their lives due to domestic violence.

#### Freddie Center

58 years old Anderson County

Mr. Center was shot and killed on August 25, 2005.

Vicki Center, Mr. Center's wife, pled guilty to Voluntary Manslaughter and was sentenced to serve five years probation.

Mr. Center is survived by two adult sons.

#### Cathy Galloway

46 years old Anderson County

Ms. Galloway was shot multiple times in the chest and killed on August 22, 2005.

Leroy Archie, the victim's boyfriend, has been charged with murder. The couple had a history of domestic violence. Mr. Archie is still awaiting trial.

Ms. Galloway is survived by two adult sons.



#### Polly Walters

37 years old Anderson County

Ms. Walters was beaten to death on May 17, 2005.

After enduring a beating that probably lasted for several minutes, Ms. Walters was then dragged from her home to a business almost 300 feet away. William Geer, the victim's boyfriend, pled guilty to Voluntary Manslaughter and was sentenced to thirty years in prison.

#### Genevive Sanders

47 years old Bamburg County

Ms. Sanders was shot and killed on April 23, 2005.

Ms. Sanders was kidnapped from her home by her ex-boyfriend, Billy Porter, who then shot Ms. Sanders and turned the gun on himself. Ms. Sanders had received an Order of Protection in the past.

Ms. Sanders is survived by two daughters

#### Pamela Gourdine

33 years old Berkeley County

Ms. Gourdine was shot and killed on May 27, 2005.

Ms. Gourdine's husband, Michael Gourdine, shot her in the head before turning the gun on himself.

Ms. Gourdine is survived by her two children.

#### Ludimila Cohe Heirs

24 years old Charleston County

Ms. Heirs was shot and killed on March 15, 2005.

Ms. Heirs was shot in her back while she slept. Her husband, Dan William Heirs, Jr., is wanted for her murder. Mr. Heirs is also wanted on charges of criminal sexual conduct in the first degree with a minor and committing a lewd act on a minor.



#### Pamela Ownby

43 years old Cherokee County

Ms. Ownby was shot and killed on April 12, 2005.

Mark Pearson, the victim's ex-boyfriend, shot Ms. Ownby when she arrived at work. Ms. Ownby had recently moved to get away from Mr. Pearson. Mr. Pearson pled guilty to murder and was sentenced to thirty years in prison.

Ms. Ownby is survived by her daughter and son.

#### Lucille Wilson

48 years old Clarendon County

Ms. Wilson was shot and killed on September 17, 2005.

Ms. Wilson was shot in the head while at her mother's house. Her mother and daughter were also in the home at the time of the shooting. Henry Wilson, the victim's former husband, has been charged with murder, assault and battery with intent to kill, and burglary. He still awaits trial.

Ms. Wilson is survived by three daughters.



#### Jennifer Denise Stonerock

27 years old Florence County

Ms. Stonerock was beaten and stabbed to death on May 7, 2005.

Eric Tessner, Ms. Stonerock's boyfriend, has been charged with murder. Witnesses say an argument could be heard and that it sounded as if Ms. Stonerock was being slammed into walls. Mr. Tessner is awaiting trial.

Ms. Stonerock was six and a half months pregnant when she was killed.

#### Leroy Wells

23 years old Florence County

Mr. Wells was stabbed to death on November 26, 2005.

Leroy Wells was stabbed in the left side of his chest. His girlfriend, Ashley Lynch, has been charged with his murder and is awaiting trial.

#### Laura Ling

43 years old Georgetown County

Ms. Ling was strangled to death on April 8, 2005.

Ms. Ling's daughter was sexually assaulted at the time of the murder. Stephen Stanko, Ms. Ling's boyfriend, has been found guilty of murder, assault and battery with intent to kill, criminal sexual conduct, armed robbery and kidnapping. Mr. Stanko now sits on death row.

Ms. Ling is survived by her teenage daughter.



#### Barbara Booker

39 years old Greenville County

Ms. Booker was shot and killed on December 2, 2005.

Johnny Odell Davis, the victim's boyfriend, has been charged with murder and is awaiting trial.



#### Wendy Michelle Robertson

36 years old Greenville County

Ms. Robertson was shot and killed on December 18, 2005.

Ms. Robertson met with her estranged husband, Johnny Robertson, so he could retrieve some of his things. Mr. Robertson then shot his wife and turned the gun on himself. Ms. Robertson's mother was in the home at the time of the shooting.

Ms. Robertson is survived by two daughters.

## Denise Omogun

41 years old Greenwood County

Ms. Omogun was shot and killed by May 6, 2005.

Ms. Omogun and her husband, Augustine Omogun, had an argument which their son attempted to intervene. Mr. Omogun then found a gun, shot his wife, and then himself. Their son witnessed the shooting.

Ms. Omogun was survived by two sons and one daughter.

## Jennifer Beury

31 years old Horry County

Ms. Beury was shot and killed on June 24, 2005.

Ms. Beury's boyfriend, Brian Clarke, shot Ms. Beury and then himself. Ms. Beury's body was found two days after the incident occurred.

## William Paul Claridy

54 years old Horry County

Mr. Claridy was stabbed and killed on July 28, 2005.

Beverly Lynn Claridy, the victim's wife, has been charged with murder. Ms Claridy is awaiting trial.

#### Ebonetess Davis

20 years old Horry County

Ms. Davis was stabbed to death on February 15, 2005.

Lekan "Tommy" Fawni, the victim's live-in boyfriend, has been charged with murder and is awaiting trial. According to a witness, there had been previous violence in the home.

#### Malcolm Graham

50 years old Horry County

Mr. Graham was shot and killed on February 10, 2005.

Tracy Dowell, the victim's girlfriend, has been charged with murder and is awaiting trial. The couple had been arguing the night before the shooting.

## Mary Jill Hapeman

41 years old Horry County

Ms. Hapeman was shot and killed on October 8, 2005.

Ms. Hapeman was in the parking lot of a local store when her husband, David Hapeman, shot her and then turned the gun on himself. One of Ms. Hapeman's children was with her when the shooting occurred.

Ms. Hapeman is survived by two sons and a daughter.

#### Lluvia Aurora Sanchez

20 years old Horry County

Ms. Sanchez was stabbed to death on June 1, 2005.

Ardelio Xabate Lopez, Ms. Sanchez's exhusband, stabbed her in the parking lot of a local business. The victim's brother was also injured during the incident. Mr. Lopez pled guilty to murder and received a thirty year prison sentence.

## Jesse Lopez

25 years old Jasper County

Ms. Lopez was killed from a knife wound on September 22, 2005.

Jose Pinto Lopez, Ms. Lopez's husband, cut his wife's throat and then attempted to kill himself. Mr. Lopez pled guilty to Voluntary Manslaughter and was sentenced to twelve and a half years in prison.



#### Tiffany Williams

20 years old Laurens County

Ms. Williams was shot and killed on October 16, 2005.

Ms. Williams was shot by her boyfriend, Kory Todd, who then shot himself. Mr. Todd chased Ms. Williams, who ran into a neighboring apartment. Mr. Todd shot down the door, killed Ms. Williams, and then himself. Mr. Todd was out on bond for a CDV charge at the time of the murder.

Ms. Williams is survived by three children.

#### Jeanette Farrior

50 years old Lexington County

Ms. Farrior was strangled to death on August 2, 2005.

John Rivers, the victim's boyfriend, is awaiting trial for murder. The couple had an argument the day of the murder.



#### Glenda Brooks

55 years old Orangeburg County

Ms. Brooks was stabbed to death on November 3, 2005

Ms. Brooks was stabbed in her home. Lee Burns Brooks, the victim's husband, has been charged with murder and is awaiting trial.

Ms. Brooks is survived by four daughters and one son.



#### Michael Lusk

27 years old Pickens County

Mr. Lusk was stabbed to death on September 15, 2005.

Tammy Alma Cox, the victim's live-in girlfriend, is awaiting trial for murder.

#### Jamesinia Perry

45 years old Richland County

Ms. Perry was shot to death on December 23, 2005.

Ms. Perry had multiple gun shot wounds to her chest and leg. Donald Ray Perry, the victim's husband, has been charged with murder. The couple separated six months prior to the shooting.

The victim is survived by two daughters, two step-daughters and a step-son.

#### Simone Garrett

24 years old Spartanburg County

Ms. Garrett was shot to death on August 8, 2005.

John Leroy Brayboy, Ms. Garrett's boyfriend, is awaiting trial for murder. Police had investigated domestic violence in their home before.

#### Latonya Jones

24 years old Spartanburg County

Ms. Jones was beaten and strangled to death on July 4, 2005.

Ms. Jones body was found in a closet by a family member. Her boyfriend, Brian Wilson, is awaiting trial for murder.

Ms. Jones is survived by two daughters.

## Brenda Rogers

56 years old Spartanburg County

Ms. Rogers was shot to death on December 17, 2005.

Danny Rogers, Ms. Rogers husband, shot his wife and then shot himself. During this incident, other people in the home were shot and killed as well.

Ms. Rogers is survived by a son.

#### Gloria Thomas

22 years old Spartanburg County

Ms. Thomas was stabbed to death on January 4, 2005.

Ms. Thomas was stabbed twenty-two times by her boyfriend, Tyrone Bell Perry. Ms. Thomas was driving to her mother's house and Mr. Perry tried to stop her. Ms. Thomas got out of her car and tried to run away; however, Mr. Perry caught Ms. Thomas and stabbed her twenty-two times. He pled guilty to murder and was sentenced to fifty years in prison. Mr. Perry had been convicted of Criminal Domestic Violence in the past.

## Caroline Lipford

26 years old Union County

Ms. Lipford was shot to death on June 7, 2005.

Mark Bobby Blackwood, the victim's husband, shot his wife and then himself.

Ms. Lipford is survived by one daughter and one son.

## Jessica Craig Gainey

21 years old York County

Ms. Gainey was shot to death on November 13, 2005.

Ms. Gainey and her husband, Curtis Gainey, got into an argument, which ended with Mr. Gainey shooting Ms. Gainey in the face. Mr. Gainey pled guilty to Voluntary Manslaughter and was sentenced to thirty years in prison. Ms. Gainey's son was in the home at the time of the shooting.

Ms. Gainey is survived by her son.
